


2011 Annual Report

HIGHLIGHTS:

- 4,993 animals entered the shelter.
- 4,586 animals were reunited with their families or were adopted by new families.
- 254 (5.1%) were euthanized. These animals were too sick/injured or behaviorally unsound to be sent back out into the community.
- 2,950 animals were spayed/neutered by our veterinary services department; 999 of which were pets living in low-income households.
- 1,465 pets were cared for in volunteer foster homes prior to being adopted.
- KHS transitioned to 24/7 Animal Rescue dispatch services through Cencom (911) to improve customer service, response time and documentation.

• Customer surveys indicated that 94% of adopters agree they adopted a high quality pet from KHS.






