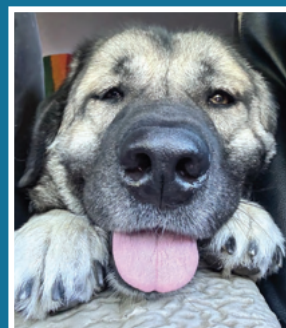

A Letter from Dr. Jen & Jamie



We're very proud of Kitsap Humane Society and the work we do. And as you read over the following pages, you'll understand why.

Over the past several years, KHS has grown from a one-building adoption center to a full-service animal welfare organization that's a model for shelters everywhere. We're constantly adding new programs to better support our community and new ways of doing things that better support the animals in our care. We're great collaborators with the businesses, organizations, and individuals who partner with us and make sure that every donated penny is spent wisely. And we save the lives of thousands of precious animals every year.

The numbers only tell part of the story though.

One of the things we're most proud of is the culture we've built and the people who believe in it. Every morning, our staff starts the day with what we call the "huddle." It's a chance for each department to give a brief update about what they're doing and how they're doing. Do they have a particularly busy day ahead of them? Is Vet Services shorthanded? Do we have enough dog walkers? Who needs help?

And invariably, staff from other departments shift over to lend a hand. Adoption team members jump in to help clean kennels. Our Volunteer team spends time helping Foster feed bottle babies. The Finance Director throws on a hat and parka to walk dogs in the rain. And when it's a big, big event – like the hoarding situations that we've dealt with in the past few months – it's all hands on deck. Staff and volunteers working shoulder-to-shoulder, hauling supplies, carrying crates, caring for animals. Supporting each other.

It's that kind of support that makes Kitsap Humane Society such a unique place and such a strong advocate for the animals in our community. Working in animal welfare is exhausting – mentally and physically. There are some very, very tough days – but they're always outnumbered by the rewarding ones. On those tough days our team members

and volunteers are always there to give each other a pep talk, a kind word, or a timely hug. And on the rewarding ones, they're there for the high-five, the congratulations, or again – the timely hug.

And without exception, at the end of each day – when the dogs have all been walked, the cats, goats, pigs, and occasional ferret have all been fed and petted, the clinic floors have been mopped, and the lights have been turned off – everyone goes home knowing that they did a good job. A worthwhile job. A job that makes a difference for the pets and people of our community. And they did it together.

But they can't do any of it without the support of our fans and supporters – people like you.

For the work they do, the time and love they give, and the dedication they demonstrated every single day of 2025, we're enormously proud. And for your support of their efforts, we're endlessly grateful. Thank you for being a part of this extraordinary team.

HOLIDAY MAGIC

Once again, our holiday events were a huge surprise in the KHS stocking, as supporters from across Kitsap joined up with us to warm our hearts on the cold winter days.

First, our online Holiday Auction saw an unprecedented number of donated auction items – from handmade quilts to original art to nights out on the town – all in support of the animals in our care. With our spokespet Zinnia watching over the November 5-16 event, \$22,137 was raised, beating our goal by more than 10%! Nice work, Zinnia!

Next, our annual Santa Paws events – one each at Olmstead Tree Farms, Bay Hay and Feed, West Hills Kia, and Eleven Winery – were again a hit with the St. Nick-loving crowd. Santa Jeff, who’s been a Kitsap Humane Society volunteer for more than three decades – put on his red suit for photos with hundreds of pets and their people to create yet another holiday memory to be cherished forever.



PEOPLE AND PETSWALK

Sometimes you just need to go on a long walk with your best friend – and a few hundred other pet-loving people.

PetsWALK, presented by Animal Emergency & Specialty Center, just keeps getting bigger and better each year. The 5K jaunt through Poulsbo brought together 356 registered participants (and a whole lot more that only attended the after-race party) and between peer-to-peer fundraising, sponsorships, and vendors, more than \$78,000 was raised for animals in our community.

Thank you to everyone who made this event an overwhelming success, including the 80 volunteers and staff who help pull it off, all of our generous sponsors, the supporters who built teams and raised money, and each and every person who leashed up a puppy or carted a cat for the festivities. We can’t wait do it all over again on June 6th!

OPEN HOUSE

We love showing off our campus! There’s no better way to demonstrate to the community what we do, than letting people see behind the scenes. On September 23rd, we welcomed our neighbors to meet animals, hear about our programs, talk to animal care professionals one-on-one, and even have a little pizza. Over 200 individuals showed up to be a part of the fun and learn what it takes to make an organization like Kitsap Humane Society tick.



ANIMAL KRACKERS

Our annual gala, Animal Krackers – presented by Brown Bear Car Wash – was a sensational soiree straight out of the Seventies. Held at Clearwater Casino Resort on October 4, the party got going with live music from the ABBA tribute band, ABBAgraphs before telling the story of everything Kitsap Humane Society does. At the end of the night, when the auctions were over and the paddles were retired, we raised \$457,000 for our mission (thanks to everyone who bid, including our longtime volunteer Kathy Oliphant, who treated her whole table to Pina Paw-Ladas).

The highlight of the evening, however, was the presentation of the second annual “Apple of Our Eye” award – in honor of former board member Sherry Appleton. Our extraordinary volunteers Karen and Mike Mitchell were the 2025 recipients for their outstanding work in fostering more kittens than they could possibly count, and helping with vaccine clinics, IT and phones issues, and just generally being incredible human beings.

“This is just an incredible place... you do so much.”

So said a visiting board member of another animal shelter when taking a recent tour of Kitsap Humane Society. While we love the compliment and absolutely agree, building an organization like KHS ain't easy. It requires a lot of help. A lot of work. And a lot of time. Over the past three years, we've been building what even other shelter professionals look to as a model. It's not just an adoption center or a place to bring strays. It's a campus of "wrap-around services" designed to make life better for families – not just their pets, but the people too.

And in 2025, we delivered more of those services than ever before – thanks to the help and commitment of a lot of people and organizations.

From our low-cost vaccine and microchip clinics – during which we deliver free vaccines and more to pet people in need – to Spay Week – when we altered nearly 300 cats in just five days – we keep creating new ways to support our community. Our Barks and Rec program allowed families who can't have a dog (but would really like one) to take a pupper out for a

couple of hours of play. Sam's Fund – which foots the bill for injured pets whose family simply can't afford needed care – saved the lives of countless animals. Our Pet Food Pantry handed out more than 65,000 pounds of free pet food to families in dire financial situations – something that was a lifesaver for many during the November government shutdown. And our role as Washington state's sole Greater Good Charities ambassador ensured that the Pantry – and the shelves of other nonprofits across the state – never went bare.

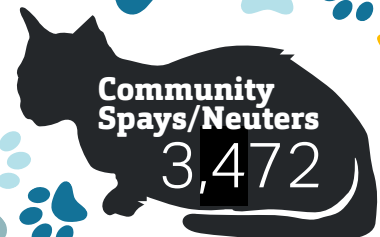
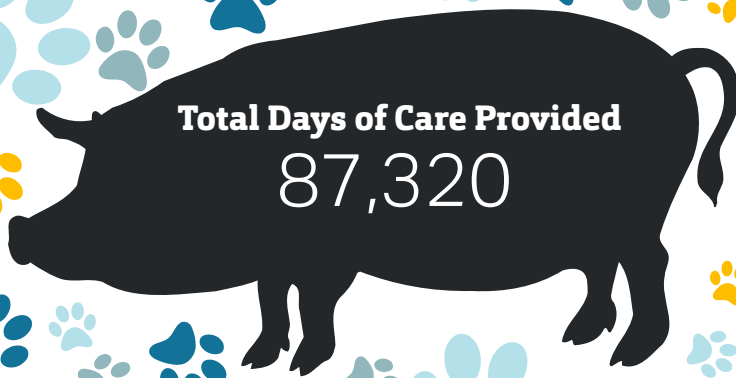
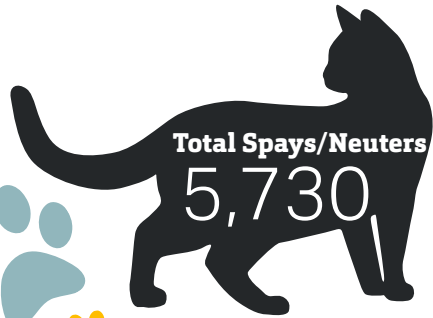
Along the way, in June we hired a fifth veterinarian to expand access to affordable care. We remodeled "Winterhaven" – our oldest dog holding space – to make it more welcoming to all. We boosted our volunteer and foster corps. We fostered partnerships locally and nationally with organizations from Haselwood Auto Group and Milgard to Grey Muzzle and the ASPCA. And we began building an endowment that will keep the ship afloat even in the worst of economic times. Most importantly, we rescued the animals we all love so much, saved precious lives, and kept families together

That board member was right: it really is an incredible place. Thank you for being part of an extraordinary 2025.

THE CLASS OF 2025

The KHS alums of 2025 were a special group, all set up to be “Most Likely to Succeed” thanks to the care and compassion of our staff, volunteers, and fosters. Here are just a few of the 2,874 animals who were adopted last year, graduating to new homes as the Class of 2025.



WABBIT

In April 2025, a store owner in Port Orchard caught a stray rabbit in his parking lot. Sadly, its ears had been tied together with a rubber band and had been so for a long time. As it was constricting blood flow, it was

determined the ears would need to be removed to save the bunny’s life. Three days later, vets went to work removing his ears and he while he came out of his ear removal surgery confused and a little frustrated, he was feeling a whole lot better. Now named “Wabbit” the little guy was taken home by a vet assistant and just 24 hours later, he was running around playing with toys, soaking up all the cuddles and treats. He’s now living the good life with a KHS team member. And it’s all thanks to the team of lifesavers at the Kitsap Humane Society and people like you.



HANK

Found by the side of the road in April 2025, Hank was riddled with fleas – but that was the least of his worries. It was an apparent respiratory infection that had everyone really worried. He was clearly in distress, his throat

bulging out like a bullfrog with each breath. It was soon discovered that Hank had an enormous tonsillar mass that was blocking his breathing and the “bullfrog effect” was just him trying to stay alive. Immediate surgery was necessary. The operation was remarkably simple. Our own Dr. B reached in and pulled out a two-inch-long polyp – a one-shot move that had to work. And it did. Hank was adopted on May 9, 2025 and is now a happy and active cat and “a bit of a hellion,” living in Port Orchard.



SOPHIA

Little Sophia was a three-month-old Shar Pei who was most likely hit by a car in Mason County. She had sustained a broken right femur through the distal growth plate, which meant that

even if the leg was able to heal, it wasn’t going to grow. And she was shaking from the pain. The leg was going to have to be amputated. Following the surgery, the Vet team was once again astounded by the resiliency of animals. Within hours, Sophia was recovering at the home of our Volunteer Manager, testing out her new three-legged situation and bouncing around as if this is how she’d always been. And on Halloween day 2025, just three weeks after coming through our doors, Sophia was adopted by a family with a very excited little girl who came dressed in a pink hoodie to match the one her new best friend was wearing.



BUCKWHEAT THE G.O.A.T.

In September of 2025 a Port Orchard resident was driving through town when he spotted something unusual in the middle of the Old Clifton Road

roundabout, a stray goat nibbling on plants. He tried to care for him for a few nights, but quickly realized he was in over his head so he brought the obviously ill stray to KHS. After many tests, it was determined that the goat was severely emaciated, malnourished, anemic, and battling pneumonia. Despite all of this, his sweet, silly personality never dimmed. He charmed everyone he met and became a staff favorite. By November, Buckwheat was a whole new goat. His pneumonia and anemia had cleared, he’d put on healthy weight, and he was finally ready to find a family. Along the way, he made tons of friends, including our weekly volunteer crew, the Bremerton Sockeyes Hockey Team, and formed a sweet bond with another goat, Cooper. He was adopted in November and is living his best life in Seabeck.

BARKS AND REC

You love dogs (heck, who doesn't?), but you just can't adopt one right now. Maybe your apartment doesn't allow pets. Maybe your partner is allergic. Maybe you just don't have the time to spend. Whatever the reason, wouldn't it be great if you could just borrow a furry friend for a few hours?

VACCINE CLINICS

What started out with just a few sign-ups in late 2024 expanded into a wildly popular monthly event in 2025: Low-cost Vaccine & Microchip Clinics.

If you've recently had your pet vaccinated, you know how expensive it can be, making it very difficult for people without means have a pet. Our Veterinary staff recognized this and responded with monthly clinics that offer these services without a clinic fee – charging only for the cost of the vaccines and microchips. "It's been a fantastic success," says KHS veterinarian Dr. Alecia. "We're just happy to help keep these pets healthy and with the people they love."

SPAY WEEK

There are so many reasons why pets need to be spayed and neutered. We're told that just one unaltered female cat and her offspring could produce 420,000 cats in just seven years. In six years, a female dog and her offspring could produce 67,000 puppies. That's a lot of animals and there's not enough homes for all of them. What's more, altered pets generally live healthier, longer lives when they've been altered.

KHS provides such services all year 'round, but our celebration of Spay and Neuter Awareness Month each February is a sight to behold. Over five days each year, our Vet Services team takes on the Herculean task of altering as many animals as possible. In an operation that could easily be absolute chaos, but is always a carefully orchestrated and amazingly organized event, staff and volunteers work shoulder-to-shoulder, prepping animals, performing surgeries, and preparing them to go home. In all, nearly 300 animals were altered over the five days, in addition to 14 shelter surgeries (including foreign body extractions and an enucleation), seven trap-neuter-return appointments for community cats, and one emergency dystocia procedure.
